CAMP QUALITY VISIT





Hi parents and carers!

We're writing from Camp Quality to let you know that our Primary School Education Program has been invited to perform at your child's school.

At Camp Quality our services and programs are made specifically to help children 0-13 who are impacted by a cancer diagnosis, that their own, or the diagnosis of someone they love like a brother, sister, mum or dad. At no cost to schools, parents or students -our vivacious and loveable puppets, Kylie. Dean and Melissa visit schools to help support children affected by cancer. The puppets dispel myths and misconceptions that are commonly associated with the illness. Since 1988 our program has visited schools across Australia, sharing an interactive, engaging narrative that explains:

- The ins and outs of cancer
- Why their peer who has undergone treatment may look a little different (due to the side effects of chemotherapy)
- Why it's important to be supportive of their classmate who is either living with cancer or has a diagnosed parent or sibling
- . That cancer isn't contagious, so it's ok to play
- . The importance of positivity and recognising our own strengths

"It took away the stigma and fear from cancer. As we have a student at our school being treated for leukaemia, it helped the children understand what she is going through and why she has lost her hair. Having an understanding of the disease has certainly increased the empathy in the other children too." - Primary school principal

"The manner in which the show addresses cancer is age appropriate while clearly articulating the facts. It has helped me to be able to talk about cancer in a positive and reassuring manner"-Primary school teacher

Following the performance, students are encouraged to ask questions and share their concerns. While we are able to answer most of their questions and concerns, we provide teachers with resources to supplement the performance and aid classroom discussion. If any concerns arise after the performance, please feel free to contact us.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - CSEF

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link

between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

 new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year. changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

TOOLAMBA GROWTH PLAN 2020 AND TOOLAMBA PRECINCT STRUCTURE PLAN – COMMUNITY SUBMISSIONS

The Council is proposing two amendments to the Toolamba Growth Plan 2020 and the Toolamba Precinct Structure Plan 2018 to finalise the planning scheme for Toolamba.

One amendment is to incorporate housing and streetscape typologies into the Toolamba Growth

Plan (C224) and the other relates to adopting a Precinct Structure Plan (C168) to rezone 54 hectares of land southwest of Toolamba township to the Urban Growth Zone.

Over the last few years, you may have provided feedback multiple times as part of community consultation to develop the plans. This is the final opportunity that will determine if these two amendments are adopted into the final planning scheme for Toolamba. Amendments to a planning scheme can affect the whole community because they may change the way land can be used or developed. They can also change the basis for making planning decisions in the future.

We strongly encourage as many people from our township to make a submission to the Council when the exhibition period opens, no matter what that opinion is of the amendments. Some of you will be supportive of them and some of you will have concerns that you wish to express

The timeframe for the amendment process is attached to this newsletter, but most importantly the timeframe that you can make a submission is from 12th March to 19th April, 2021.

Submissions forms are available from the Greater Shepparton Council website and must be submitted back to them during these dates.

Estimated timeline: Amendment C224 – Toolamba Growth Plan 2020 and Amendment C168 – Toolamba Precinct Structure Plan 2018

The figure below outlines an estimated timeline for the progression of Amendment C224 and Amendment C168, as at 22 February 2021. Both Amendments are expected to proceed concurrently. Please note that the Amendment process is complex, and the timeline may change.

- Notification of Amendment: Residents receive written notification from Council that the Amendments have been prepared and will be exhibited.
 - Exhibition Period: Council invites submissions on the Amendments for a period of six weeks.
 - Consideration of Submissions: Council officers consider all submissions. Requested changes may be accepted in full or in part, or not accepted. Submitters will receive a letter outlining Council's response.
 - Planning Panel Report: The Panel will compile a report and may make recommendations

 Planning Panel Hearing: If required, Planning Panels Victoria will conduct an independent hearing, assessing the amendment documents and all submissions.

- on the Amendment(s). Council has 28 days to consider the report before it is released to the public.
- Council consideration: Council considers all submissions and the panel report and decides whether to adopt or abandon the Amendments. The item is tabled at an Ordinary Council Meeting.

 Ministerial Approval: If Council adopts the Amendments, they are then submitted to the
- Minister for Planning for approval. Following notification of the Minister's approval (published in the Victoria Government Gazette), the Amendments take effect in the Planning Scheme. The approval timeframe is variable, and can take several months.
